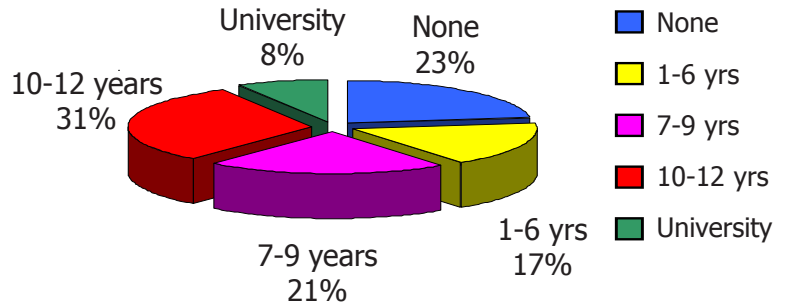

Level of Education in Country of Origin



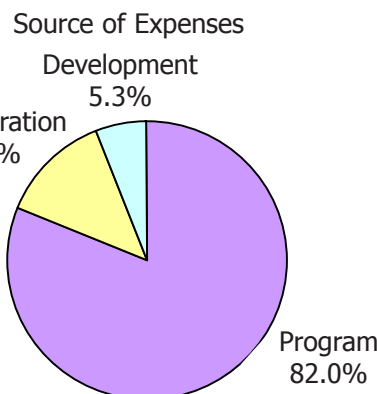
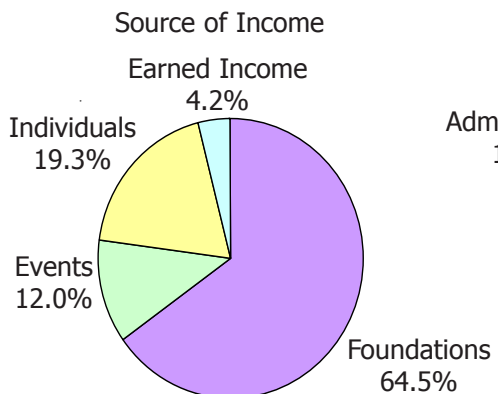
121 students received English and practical living skills education.
